Traffic Advisory: Fred C. Atchley and North Parkway Bridges

TDOT contractors have scheduled gas pipeline inspections and repairs on two bridges near downtown Sevierville beginning next week.

The right southbound travel lane on the Fred C. Atchley Bridge on Highway 66, between King Street and West Main Street, will be closed from approximately 8:30AM-6:00PM on April 30, May 1 and May 2.

The right southbound travel lane on the North Parkway (Ultraflow) bridge, between Burrige Drive and Main Street, will be closed from approximately 8:30AM-6PM on May 7, 8 and 9.



Motorists should expect delays and consider an alternate route. Work is conditional based upon weather.

National Day of Prayer-Thursday, May 3

Sevier County's National Day of Prayer event is set for May 3 at the Sevier County Courthouse. The event will begin at 6:00PM.

The National Day of Prayer was created in 1952 by a joint resolution of Congress, and signed into law by President Harry S. Truman. In 1988, the law was unanimously amended by both the House and the Senate and signed into law by President Ronald Reagan on Thursday, May 5, 1988, designating the first Thursday of May as a day of national prayer. Every president since 1952 has signed a National Day of Prayer proclamation.

Snyder Road Improvements Underway

TDOT contractors have started work on a section of Snyder Road, making road and bridge improvements.

The project encompasses Snyder Road from Lenz Drive to Hardin Road, north of Smokies Stadium. The project is being funded by the federal Local Interstate Collector program and Sevier County government.

The work will take place daily (Monday-Friday). The estimated project completion date is November 30, 2018, weather and other conditions permitting.

Some work will require single lane closures; flagmen will be present. Short term delays are likely when a lane is closed.
