

## National Peace Officers Memorial Day May 15



Again this year, communities across the United States will come together during National Police Week, May 13-19, to honor and remember those law enforcement officers who made the ultimate sacrifice, as well as the family members, friends and fellow officers they left behind.

On May 15, the Fraternal Order of Police and the Fraternal Order of Police Auxiliary host a ceremony on the west steps of the U.S. Capitol to honor fallen law enforcement officers and their families. In tribute to American law enforcement officers and at the request of the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial Fund, **Public Law 103-**

**322 designates May 15 as National Peace Officers Memorial Day**, which is one of only two days each year during which government agencies, businesses and residents are to fly their U.S. flags at half-staff.

"We ask everyone to take a moment tomorrow to reflect upon the sacrifice that these 360 officers, their families, and friends, have made," Sevierville Police Chief Joseph Manning said. "Like all officers, they risked their lives every day to protect our communities from those that would do us harm."
