

Hot Vehicle Interiors Can Become Deadly in Moments

The [Sevierville Police Department](#) urges parents and pet owners to be cognizant of the potential danger of leaving their children or pets in vehicles during warm weather.

Just a few minutes inside a car during the summer can become deadly. When the outside air temperature is just 85 degrees, vehicle interior temperatures can reach over 100 degrees in ten minutes or less.

In Tennessee, citizens may forcibly enter a vehicle if a child or

pet is in imminent danger. See the eBrief article below for details.

In the United States, serious injuries and deaths to children and pets are reported every summer. Children should NEVER be left alone in an unattended vehicle for any length of time.

KidsandCars.org notes that on average, 37 children die annually from heat-related injuries while trapped inside a vehicle.



Good Samaritan Law: Children & Pets Inside Hot Vehicles



According to the Tennessee Good Samaritan Law (TCA Section 29-34-209), persons have civil liability immunity for damage to a vehicle as a result of forcible entry to remove a child or animal IF:

The vehicle is locked or there is no other reasonable way for the child or animal to exit the vehicle;

The person reasonably believes that forcible entry into the vehicle is necessary because the child or animal is in imminent danger of suffering harm if not immediately removed from the vehicle based upon the circumstances;

And the person has contacted local law enforcement, the fire department or called 911

PRIOR to entering the vehicle.

The law also requires that a notice be placed on the vehicle windshield with your contact information, why entry was made, the location of the child or animal, and that authorities have been notified.

The [Family Aquatic Center](#) (outdoor pool, slide and splash play area) at City Park will be open for the Memorial Day weekend, May 26-28. The FAC will be open through Memorial Day, Monday, May 28, close May 29-31 and reopen for the summer season June 1.

The operating hours for the season are 11AM-5PM Monday-Friday, and 11AM-5PM Saturday and Sunday. (The Family Aquatic Center will close at 4PM due to swim meets on June 12, 14, 19 and 23.)

Traffic Advisory: Memorial Day Event Downtown



The [City of Sevierville](#) announces the temporary closure of several downtown streets on Sunday, May 27 between approximately 9:00AM-11:00AM. The closures are necessary to facilitate the Smoky Mountain Thunder Memorial Motorcycle Ride. Motorists should consider alternate routes during this period.

The following streets will be temporarily closed to traffic:

- Court Avenue from Commerce Avenue to Joy Street
- Bruce Street from the Court House to the Parkway
- Bruce Street from the Parkway to Gary Wade Blvd., during motorcycle staging near the end of the event.
