Ups and Downs for the Month: November




-Our Maintenance and Landscaping Team continues to brighten and enhance our city- we completed the install of Winterfest Displays around the City prior to the November 11th Kickoff









Construction began on November 28th on the Four (4) New Pickleball Courts at City Park. It Will be Spring of 2023 when they are done....
